MUDFORD BURIAL GROUND TABLE OF FEES, PAYMENTS AND SUMS

The fees, payments and sums will be quadrupled for non-residents of the parish for any new purchase of the Exclusive Rights of Burials and scattering of ashes. More information can be found in Mudford Cemetery Regulations on the Parish Council's website.

The Parish Council requires the Undertaker to arrange for the grave to be dug. The siting of the grave and other details can be settled with the Parish Clerk and Cemetery Caretaker.

Minister's Fees to be negotiated with the undertaker.

Monuments, Gravestones, Tablets and Monumental Inscriptions

For the right to erect or place on a grave or vault in respect of which the Exclusive Rights of Burial has been granted. Please consult with the Parish Clerk or the cemetery caretaker for advice.

All memorials must be fixed in accordance to the NAMM code of working practice and BS8415/2018 and the memorials installed with registered fixers of NAMM RQMF, or BRAMM. Proof with copies of certificates is required.

- A small moveable vase not exceeding 12 inches in height (30cm). £50.00
- Any small moveable vase must be approved by Mudford Parish Council. No glass vases are permitted.
- Photo plaques as part of a headstone are permitted - maximum size 6 inches by 4 inches (15cm x 10cm). No other permanent ornaments, decorations, mementoes or trees are permitted.

Maintenance of Memorials

It is the responsibility of the purchaser of any memorial which requires attention if subsidence or other problems occur, to arrange maintenance with an approved stonemason.

Maintenance of Graves

Where a small moveable vase is placed on the graves, it is the responsibility of those placing it to keep the grass cut around and between them, where machines cannot run. No glass vases are permitted.

Maintenance of Cemetery

Mudford Parish Council will undertake the care and maintenance of the cemetery, including the grass cutting with the above proviso, where vases prevent machine cutting.

Policy of Sunken Graves

Mudford Parish Council will correct graves that have sunk in the first two years. After that, the Council will contact the relatives of the deceased to arrange correction.

Headstone Safety

Mudford Parish Council will risk assess headstones on a regular basis to ensure that they are secure in the ground and do not represent a health and safety risk. Where a headstone is found to be loose in the ground, it will be the responsibility of the family to meet the cost of making it safe. If no living family can be located, appropriate action to make it safe will be taken by the Parish Council.
